PROFESSOR DATO' DR. ANWAR FAZAL

Professor Dato' Dr. Anwar Fazal is deeply involved in addressing local and international civil and social issues. He has contributed extensively in consumerism, health environmental, human rights and social ethics issues. Dr Anwar Fazal also known as Father of the Malaysian NGO Movement concurrently holds the position of Professor at the USM Center for Public Policy and International Studies (CenPris). Currently he serves on the jury of the Goldman Environmental Prize, among the largest awards for grassroots environmental activists.

Some of the awards he has been conferred include:

- The Right Livelihood Award for his work in promoting and protecting the public interest in 1982.
- Activist of the Year" in 1983 by Ralph Nader's magazine
- "Global 500" Award by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) for his work on consumers and the environment
- Gandhi-King-Ikeda Community Builders Prize by the Martin Luther King Jr. International Chapel, Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia, USA on 21 October 2006
- International Health Award in 1995 by the La Leche League for his work in promoting the welfare of mothers and children world over.



PROF. DR. G. SURESH KUMAR

Professor G. Suresh currently serves as a Professor of Parasitology and a member of the UM Senate, Faculty of Medicine, University Malaya with a strong research interest on emerging protozoan infections. Has published more than 160 papers including conference papers and have supervised more than 85 research students including at the level of PhD. Have established more than 9 research international collaboration and has served as WHO Steering committee member in World water guidelines, Zoonosis and water, Shellfish and water since 2002. Has won several awards including National Young Scientist Award – 1996, the Toray Science Grant -1995, Chartered membership to Institute of Biology which carried the title CBiol, MIBiol -1999, Commonwealth Scholarship -2000, Golden Innovative award -2001, Golden Innovative Award at Annual MINDS 2002, Gold Medal at International Innovation Exhibition at Geneva 2002, MSPTM medal for outstanding contribution to the field of Parasitology and Tropical Medicine 2002, National Innovation award by MAMPU - 2003 and winner of Toray Award, 2008. Also served as the Deputy President of the Sathya Sai Central Council of Malaysia.



PROF DATUK SERI DR VICTOR WEE

Datuk Seri Dr. Victor Wee has enjoyed a distinguished civil service career, rising to the rank of Secretary General at the Ministry of Tourism where he ran the successful Visit Malaysia 2007 campaign. Datuk Seri Dr Wee was also instrumental in establishing the Cabinet Committee on Tourism and Malaysia My Second Home (MM2H) One Stop Centre.

He has also been involved in consultancy assignments for the United Nations World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO). Datuk Seri Dr. Victor Wee was a Founding Member of Buddhist Gem Fellowship.

Upon retirement, he served as Chairman of Malaysia Tourism Promotion Board and in 2010 and went on to lead the Tourism Laboratory for the Economic Transformation Programme to formulate the roadmap for the tourism industry for 2010-2020. His other notable roles include being an advisor to the Ministry of Finance, Senior Director of Economic Planning Unit, and Deputy Head of the National Economic Action Council, where he prepared the National Economic Recovery Plan during the Asian Financial Crisis.

Currently, Datuk Seri Dr. Victor Wee serves as a Professor in the School of Hospitality, Tourism and Culinary Arts (TCHT), at Taylor's University.
